Music for piano duo offers a remarkably extensive repertoire, ranging from arrangements of beloved large-scale works such as operas and symphonies to original compositions and intimate salon pieces. The Shelest Piano Duo will share their passion for this art form with "Rhapsody for Two," a program of music for piano-4 hands from American, French, and Ukrainian composers.
